Conservatory End-of-Year Gala Events

Talented students from all over Los Angeles Unified School District wowed audiences at the Conservatory of Fine Arts 37th Annual End-of-Year Gala Events.



At the Visual Arts Final Art Show on April 21, 2018, 290 student artists displayed their best artwork in the Fine Arts Gallery at California State University Los Angeles. Ten graduating seniors, many of whom have participated in the Conservatory for eight or more years, were awarded art scholarships to continue their studies in college. More than 225 student performers took to the stage at the Performing Arts Final

Showcase Performance on the afternoon of April 28, 2018, in 25 short acts at Esteban Torres High School to demonstrate their talents in dance, drama, and vocal music. Seven graduating seniors culminated their years in the program with solos and lead roles.

experiences and skills that will help them navigate the 21st century, they fostered a partnership with the Jet Propulsion Laboratory




(JPL) in La Canada Flintridge, California. The JPL scientists visited Euclid Avenue Elementary School and provided the students and staff with many resources and even brought a Mars Rover to the school.

Fourth grade magnet students in Ms. Dillingham's class were challenged to write a grant/proposal, as well as, design and

create a Mars Rover. The students went through a process that required them to solve a design problem, think like an expert and analyze phenomena. As a part of this process, the students were also required to build a budget, read primary sources, view videos of the Mars Rover, test their designs during a performance challenge, and confer with JPL scientists and a NASA astronaut.
